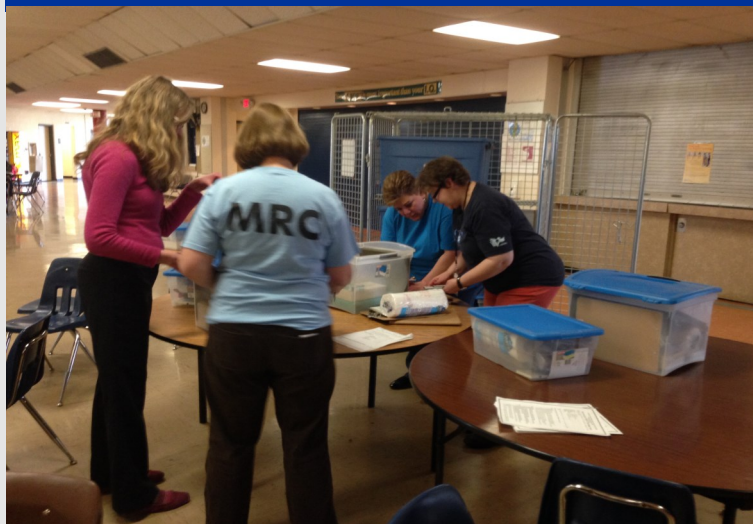

## 2015 Central Ohio Volunteer Training Summit Presentation Information

This year's volunteer summit is open to the 15 central Ohio region MRC units and will include 3 separate trainings. The first training will speak to working with individuals who have functional needs during a deployment. Representatives from the Clark County EMA and Clark County Health Department will present on this topic and will give advice from past exercises and real life events. The second training will have Columbus Public Health walk through a tabletop exercise on the events leading up the opening of a POD site during a biological incident. Traditionally the MRC has focused on activities post the decision to prophylaxis the community. This will be a fresh and unique perspective on public health and the MRC role. Lastly, per request from many volunteers, our afternoon training will have Franklin County Public Health discussing infectious diseases and the roles of the health department and MRC. Examples from recent real world events will be covered. Thank you to the MRC leadership team for their involvement in getting presenters and planning the summit!

## Public Health Outreach Grants

One of the ways the FC&C MRC stays active is to work with Columbus Public Health and Franklin County Public Health on public health outreach activities like farmer's markets, rabies vaccination clinics, seasonal flu clinics, health fairs and more. These daily opportunities help build capacity for the health departments, allow volunteers and staff to interact regularly and exercise activities that might also be needed during an emergency. The FC&C MRC is currently looking for grants to help assist in funding public health outreach. - Tessa and Trent will be in Atlanta for the National Preparedness Summit from April 12-17th.



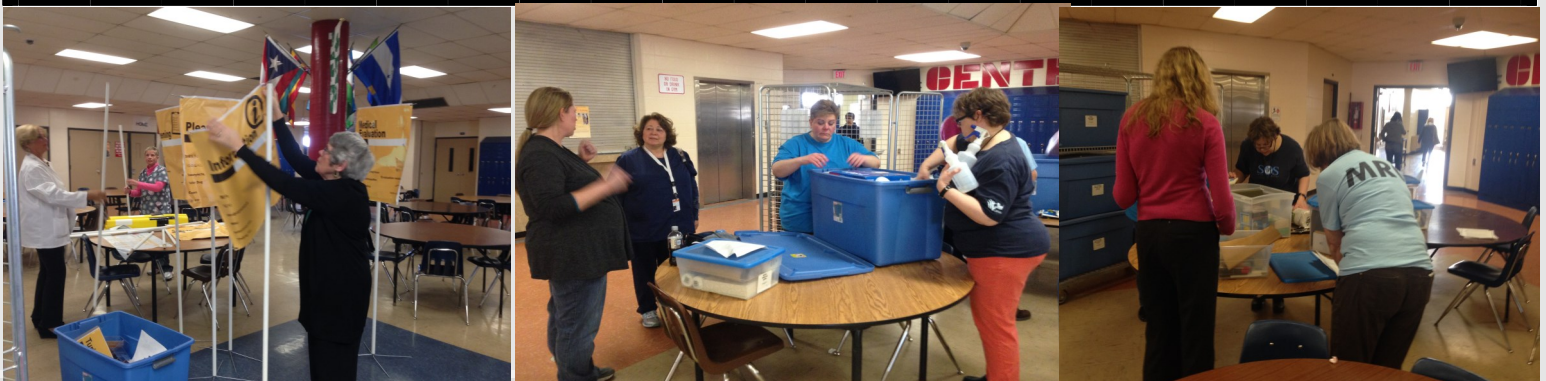

### Upcoming 2015 MRC Demographic and Volunteering Profile Survey

We will be conducting a short survey of all the registered MRC volunteers by the end of April. This will help our MRC unit in numerous ways.
