Volunteer Spotlight

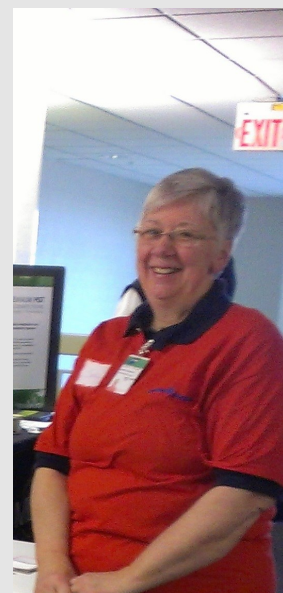
Name: Jackie Danalewich , MRC Leadership Team Volunteer

How long I've been here in Columbus: We moved here in the spring of 1986 from Connecticut.

How long have I been in the MRC: I think I started volunteering with the MRC in 2005 or 06. I think my first drill and orientation was at the all city exercise at Crew Stadium.

Special skills/interests: I have worked in the volunteer arena since the first day my oldest child started Kindergarten about 40 years ago. I have worked mostly in the medical support fields and law enforcement. In order to be effective in these areas I have tried to keep up with the basics like CPR, AED, First Aid and ICS through CERT. I have gone through the Westerville and Genoa Citizen Police Academy training and the FBI Citizen Police Academy. I continue training and volunteering with all of these departments. My special interest is with advocating for the most vulnerable populations (victims, elderly, homeless and mentally ill) within the medical and law enforcement settings. Volunteering with SARNCO (Sexual Assault Response Network of Central Ohio) and COSATF (Central Ohio Sexual Assault Task Force) has allowed me to support many people in the past 15 years. The MRC has helped me to understand and appreciate how Columbus and Franklin County fits into the care of the general population and the people I most desire to serve .

Something fun about myself: Probably working with people first and my pets second. At last count I had about 65 pets, all sizes and shapes (some as large as 8 inches). Most are gold fish and a few frogs. The goldfish will eat out of my hand and come rushing up when they see anyone coming. We spend many relaxing hours watching their antics.
